INSTRUCTIONS

Artist information

Name of artist: Research the artist's background, including their education, training, and career highlights.

Reputation: Evaluate the artist's reputation in the art world, including any awards, exhibitions, and critical reviews.

Provenance: Confirm the artwork's history of ownership and ensure it has a clear and documented provenance.

Signature/Marks: Verify the artist's signature or any distinguishing marks that authenticate the piece.

Artwork details

Alternate titles: Note the title and any alternate names the artwork may have.

Date of creation: Determine when the piece was created to understand its place within the artist's career timeline.

Condition and Restoration

Current condition: Inspect for any damage, wear, or deterioration.

Restoration history: Check if the artwork has undergone any restoration or conservation efforts, and evaluate the quality of these interventions.

Future conservation needs: Assess potential future restoration or conservation needs.

Personal considerations
